

Dear Parents and Carers,

It seems just a short time ago since we were basking in hot sunshine and enjoying one of the hottest summers on record, and now, we fast approach the festive season with the real prospect of a white Christmas here in Dorset; where has that time gone!

Here at Compass we have certainly been busy and it is my pleasure to showcase, via this newsletter, a small selection of the key events of the term. Just to highlight a couple, the links with Dorset Marvels and Cosmic Cactus should really help our older students focus on their all-important next steps and careers planning journey.

The off-site curriculum options, like Max Events, Key Stage 3 Outdoor Education and the Maritime Programme have got off to a great start and I am hearing fabulous things about how well our students are engaging and achieving in them. Long may that continue?

We're also starting our 'Reading at Compass' initiative, designed to promote the importance of reading, and in particular, reading for pleasure, as a skill for life across all of our age groups and ability range. Recently Mark, our Deputy Head has written to you to explain this. If you can help us to recycle appropriate reading material for which you no longer have a need, donations gratefully accepted.

A couple of gentle reminders from me please: it is unfortunate that on occasions our 'old and fragile' building suffers from some abuse and vandalism at the hands of some, and thankfully only a very small minority, of students who break things, sometimes deliberately. When this happens I'm required to send a letter to parents / carers asking for a voluntary contribution to the cost of repair. Please can you talk to your child about this if this situation arises and remind them that every penny spent on repairs is money that cannot be spent elsewhere, like, for instance, on the activities in the enrichment programme.

Directed verbal abuse, again, from a tiny minority of students seems to be increasing, which, I hope with your help, will be just a temporary spike and not a trend forming. It might be worth reminding your child that staff have chosen to come to work in this school with its children, some with challenging behaviour, to help those very children to succeed. They do not deserve, nor should we tolerate, verbal abuse from anyone. I hope with your continued support, together we can crack this.

## Life Skills, PSHE & Careers

In **Life Skills** this term Key Stage 3 classes have been working on looking after their Health and Wellbeing. This has included work on being aware of the effects of alcohol on the developing adolescent brain.



We have used the online course at <https://online.smashedproject.org/uk/> to help us with understanding of this topic. We have also been using the film Inside Out to help talk about emotions.

Years 9 and 10 students have been focusing on the topic of relationships: building a support network, conflict resolution and understanding the difference between healthy and unhealthy relationships. Meanwhile Year 11 students have been learning about their Post-16 options and making decisions about what they will do at the end of this academic year.



All year groups had the opportunity to commemorate Remembrance Day and our students can be proud of the respectful way they discussed the issues involved. We even made poppies which can be found around school.

### Careers and Skills for the Future



**National Rail Week** saw students across the school showing off their engineering and design skills in spaghetti bridge building. We learnt about the different jobs the rail industry brings to our area.



We also took part in the first ever **National Green Careers week**. Year 10 students took part in a live link up with the RSS Sir David Attenborough, Britain's state of the art polar research ship and met leading polar scientists from the British Antarctic Survey, live from Antarctica, as part of Protecting our Planet Day. Year 9's learnt about skills they could start developing now that will help them be a part of the job market of the future.



Penny from the **Dorset Marvels** project is helping and supporting our young people in Year 11 with their transition to Post-16 further education, apprenticeships and traineeships and we are also excited to be working with **Cosmic Cactus** Careers Advisors who have come into school this week to meet students in Years 9 and 10. 

**CONGRATULATIONS** to Dan and Zach who created a free-standing tower of a massive **76.1cm!!**




## Year 11 Mock Exams - January 2023

## Reading at Compass





Compass are currently looking to inspire our students to engage more with the written word across multiple genres and media types.


