Dear Parents and Carers,

Reflecting on the situation this time last year, there was much talk of us having to adjust to 'the new normal' as a nation. And then things eased, it felt like they were getting better for a while and now, it seems, that we're close to the same place which we were in last year as we approach our Christmas break.

So on behalf of the team at Compass, I would like to say a huge **thank you** for your support and understanding over this term. It has been difficult at times, especially, these last few weeks as our Key Stage 4 teaching team has been decimated by illness. It is never an easy decision to have to ask children to work from home, however maintaining a safe environment has been at the forefront of my decision making, every time this has become necessary. I hope that from the new year we'll be in a much healthier place.

The return to school after the summer break went well. One of the highlights of the term included a good set of examination grades from last year's Year 11 students, the vast majority of whom have moved onto their choice of Post-16 destinations. This, as you know, was through a process called TAG's, or Teacher Assessed Grades. TAGs were calculated based on a robust process of providing evidence to the exam boards of work students produced and our assessment of their grades. I'm pleased to say that none of our grades were altered by the boards which left our students with the qualifications which they deserved, and us, secure in the knowledge that our processes of assessment and grading here are 'sound'.

This is relevant for the parents and carers of this year's Year 11 students as your children prepare to sit their Mock Exams in January. At this stage it is still the government's stated intention to run 'normal' public examinations in the summer. However, these past few weeks, a new and very infectious variant of COVID has been identified, Omicron, and as infection rates in the South West and particularly in Dorset, have been running at double the national infection rate lately, we cannot rule out at this point, that public exams will not be affected again.

Please ensure your child prepares well for their 'mocks' as a good result here will be used as a source of evidence, if public exams are altered in the end. We can only award grades on the evidence your child is able to produce, if it can't be evidenced it can't be awarded.

It has been a pleasure to meet and to welcome many more new students (and their families) into Compass and the rest of this newsletter shows other highlights of the term so far.

At this point, on behalf of staff and Governors at Compass, I warmly wish you all a lovely festive season and happy new year. Stay safe, stay well and look after one another.

Level 3 will take place in the Spring Term, once the weather improves.


